Public Meeting Scheduled for US 41 from north of Port Commons (North Port) to State College of Florida (Venice)

SARASOTA, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District One will conduct a Public Meeting on Tuesday, June 7, 2022, regarding the proposed 6-mile resurfacing and median modification project on US 41 starting from north of Port Commons (North Port) to State College of Florida (Venice), Sarasota County.

To allow for maximum participation, an **Open House** from 5:30 – 7:30 p.m. will allow in-person attendees to view project exhibits and speak with FDOT staff. The in-person meeting will be held at State College of Florida, Selby Room, Manatee-Sarasota, 8000 South Tamiami Trail, Venice, FL 34293.
